My area of expertise is memory in legal settings. I am co-founder and director of the Amsterdam Laboratory for Legal Psychology (ALLP). My ERC Starting Grant research team investigates eyewitness testimony in cross-cultural settings. I regularly appear as an expert witness in criminal cases and serve on advisory committees of the Netherlands Register of Court Experts and the Dutch National Police. I teach the *Psychology* course in the international *Law in Society* programme and coordinate *Project Reasonable Doubt*, in which potentially dubious criminal convictions are re-evaluated.
